LIMITED ENTRY RULES:

- Emailed entries received by the closing date will be accepted. Entries must include a signed waiver form. If you are unable to email your entry, please contact the trial secretary to make other arrangements
- Entries will be accepted based on the time stamp/postmark date. If the trial fills with entries of the same date, priority will be given to those that volunteer at Dog On It Sports Trials! Any remaining entries will be put into a random draw.
- Dog On It Sports reserves the right to refuse any entry. Anyone not in good standing with AAC or Dog On It Sports will not be allowed entry
- Payment via e-transfer preferred (please do NOT send payment until you have received a confirmation email). If you are unable to e-transfer, please contact the trial secretary to make other arrangements. There will be a \$25.00 charge on NSF cheques.

REFUNDS: Refunds will not be given for cancellations after the closing date except for bitches in season and injury/illness to a dog, or handler (physician/veterinarian note required for injury/illness)

CLASS CHANGES:

- A dog that has entered a trial and earns a title can move up in that class, as long as the trial secretary is notified at least one week prior to the date of the trial. If you do not contact the trial secretary, you may not be permitted to move up on the day of the trial. Please check your confirmations to ensure you are entered in the proper classes.
- Same day/weekend move-ups will be allowed. If you get a title on run 1, you may move up to the next level on run 2, but it is your responsibility to inform the trial secretary ASAP.

FOR EXHIBITION ONLY (FEO) RUNS: FEO runs are permitted and will be charged the same as the regular competitors. By AAC rules, you will be ineligible for placings, qualifiers, or prizes. Please indicate on your entry form that you are running "FEO". Toys are allowed in the ring for declared FEO runs (toys must not make a sound and must be in good shape)

BITCHES IN SEASON:

- Handlers are required to notify the trial secretary that they will be running a BIS at the event as soon as it is known.
- If choosing to run a BIS, handlers are required to minimize the exposure of their BIS to other dogs. This means crating away from other dogs. There will be a designated parking area and we require that the dog is benched out of the vehicle.
- Handlers of a BIS must minimize their movement around trial grounds and potty the BIS in a designated area.
- Competitors will be notified if a BIS is on site.
- A protective mat shall be used at the start line. The mat must be supplied by the competitor.
- BIS are required to always wear protective panties when on the trial grounds except when in the designated relief area.
- BIS will run at the end of the class.
- Non-competing BIS **ARE NOT** permitted on site.

HEIGHT CATEGORIES/JUMP HEIGHTS:

- Your dog's height category is based upon its measured height as entered on its AAC height card.
- Dog's ID cards must be checked prior to competing. For completed height cards, please send a picture of the front and back of the card with your emailed entry

• All dog's that that do not have 2 signed measurements on their card will be measured during the allotted time before the first run of the day. These dogs are required to have their height card with them onsite for check-in.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS: Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the rules and regulations of the AAC, including but not limited to the following:

- This event is held under AAC Rules and Regulations and is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, pure breed or mixed breed, except aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance.
- Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the rules and regulations of the AAC and shall conform to AAC specification.
- No leads, food or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and / or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and / or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may be asked to leave the trial site and NO REFUND of fees shall be given.
- All dogs must be penned, crated or attended on leash when not in the ring. All dogs must be under control when exiting the ring. Any dog engaging in aggressive or out of control behavior upon exit of the ring por on trial grounds may be disqualified and / or required to leave the trial site and NO REFUND of fees shall be given.
- Exhibitors MUST keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please clean up after yourselves and your dogs. Anyone
 who does not clean up after themselves or their dogs may be required to leave the trial site and NO REFUND will
 be given.
- ALL DOGS MUST HAVE AN AAC ID CARD AND NUMBER TO COMPETE IN AN AAC TRIAL. If your dog does not yet have an AAC ID card, please registration with AAC at <u>www.aac.ca</u>
- The trial site is outdoors on a grass surface in a fully fenced ring.
- **COMPETITION ONLY:** Bitches in season (BIS) will be allowed to enter Dog On It Sports events. Please see the requirements to run a BIS above.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

- Regular Division: Open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current AAC rules.
- Special Division: Open to all dogs but intended for dogs which are of a size or stature that limits their jumping ability. Dogs in this category must jump one jump height lower than the height listed for regular dogs.
- Veteran Division: For dogs 7 years of age or older that are currently competing in any division and for dogs 5 years or older which have competed in the Special Division for a minimum of one calendar year. Dogs in this category must jump one jump height lower than the height listed for regular dogs. At the handler's discretion, the dog can jump two heights lower than the height listed for regular dogs (Veteran Double Drop Division).

- Junior Handler: Must have a Junior Handler ID number from the AAC. Dogs running in this category must jump at least one height lower than the height listed for regular dogs.
- Senior Handler and Handlers with Disability: Senior handlers (65 years and over) and handlers with disability may request a modified course time and a modified points requirement as per rule 2.6.2.6 Accessibility. Proof of disability or age will not be requested. A handler must indicate on the entry form if entering in the Senior/Disabled Division for each trial.
- Giant Breed Height Concession for dogs measuring over 22". Dogs considered giant breeds (see list below) or mixed breed dogs resembling giant breeds in terms of weight to height ration, may jump one or two jump heights lower than their measured Regular height when they compete in the Specials category. Dogs who have double dropped in jump height as a Special may enter the Veterans category and receive Veteran time at the age of five. (They will not drop a third height). For awards by jump height, giant breeds competing as a 16" special shall be ranked with other dogs in that same height and not in a separate category. Giant Breeds: Bernese Mountain Dog, Black Russian Terrier, Bloodhound, Bullmastiff, Dogue de Bordeaux, Great Dane, Great Pyrenees, Greater Swiss Mountain Dog, Irish Wolfhound, Kuvasz, Landseer, Leonberger, Mastiff, Neopolitan Mastiff, Newfoundland, Saint Bernard (201202a)
- Starters Games Classes: Effective January 1, 2009, moving out of Starters Games classes into Advanced now requires two (2) qualifying scores under two (2) different judges.
- Advanced Games Classes: Effective January 1, 2009, the Advanced Games classes are open to dogs that have earned two (2) qualifying scores in a particular Starters level game under two (2) different judges. Moving out of Advanced now requires three (3) qualifying scores under two (2) different judges.
- Masters Games Classes: The Masters Games classes are open to dogs that have completed three (3) qualifying scores at the Advanced level for a particular game under two (2) different judges.
- Standard Class: The Standard Class shall be for dogs that have not earned the associated standard title for their level (ADC, AADC, or MADC). A dog must achieve three (3) qualifying scores (no course or time faults) under two (2) different judges in their respective level, at an AAC Sanctioned Trial, to be awarded the Standard class title (ADC, AADC, or MADC).
- Gamblers Class: This game demonstrates the handler's strategy and the dog's ability to work at a distance from the handler. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points as possible during the opening sequence and successfully complete the gamble.
- Jumpers Class: This game demonstrates a dog's natural jumping ability. Snooker Class: This game demonstrates the handler and dog's versatility as they work together against the clock. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points as possible in the opening and closing sequences within the allotted time.
- Team Relay is now a single-level class with a title structure equivalent to Steeplechase. This is a time plus faults event where a qualifying score is earned if the time plus faults score is equal to or less than the SCT determined by the judge.
- Steeplechase: This game demonstrates the dog's ability to run and jump at high speeds while maintaining control on the A-Frame and weave poles. This is a time plus faults event where the combined time-plus-faults score must be equal to or less than the SCT as determined by the judge.
- International Biathlon: The International Biathlon classes are "All Level", open to all dogs eligible to compete in other AAC qualifying events at any performance level, and in any category. No pre-requisite is required. FEO runs are allowed. The AAC's International Biathlon is uniquely designed to be an Agility (similar to a standard run) AND a Jumpers with Weaves class of the highest performance level available. Please see rulebook for full description.

RIBBONS & ROSETTES: Rosettes will be available for Titles & Flat Ribbons are available for Qualifying Rounds, 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th Place
